Thank you for showing interest in the Massachusetts State Lottery. We hope that you will soon be joining our team of 7,500 licensed Lottery agents.

One of the numerous initiatives currently underway by the Massachusetts State Lottery concerns our disabled residents, some of whom have mobility, vision, hearing or other physical impairments. The Massachusetts State Lottery is working with advocates for people with disabilities to implement certain improvements to better serve customers with disabilities.

With this laudable goal in mind, the Massachusetts State Lottery has committed to conducting Americans with Disabilities Act site surveys at all new Lottery agent locations. This survey- the cost for which is included in the application fee- will determine whether a location has barriers impeding access by people with disabilities that need to be addressed by the new agent. Some of these barriers might include the lack of appropriate handicap-only parking or the absence of appropriate signage; missing curb cuts or ramps; narrow doorways, or counters that are too high.

The Massachusetts Lottery will work with newly licensed agents to determine if their business is functionally accessible to individuals with mobility impairments. If the accessibility of the location is limited, the Lottery will work with new agents to determine the best course of action to address or eliminate barriers to customers with disabilities. The Massachusetts State Lottery is confident that new agents share our goal to be able to sell Lottery products to all potential customers.
